Q Module One: The time has come

In this module we survey all 27 books of the New Testament. Starting with the 4 Gospels and Acts, as we look at the life of Jesus and the early years of the church, and then moving on to the 22 letters that make up the rest of the New Testament. We will see how Jesus is the fulfilment of God's plans for the world.


Q Module Two: In the beginning God...'

Here we go back to the beginning of the Bible and see that everything starts with God (Genesis 1:1). We trace the story of God's dealings with Israel through the 17 historical books of the Old Testament. We discover how God was announcing his plan to send Jesus from the very beginning.

Q Module Three: 'He will reign on David's throne'

We finish our survey of the Old Testament with a look at the 17 books of prophecy. The prophets both speak God's Word into their contemporary situations and speak about what's to come. In these books we hear the drumroll for the King who would 'reign [forever] on David's throne' (Isaiah 9:7).

Q Who is the Diocesan Bible Course for?

This course is for Christians at any stage on their journey with God who want to know more about the Bible and how it relates to their lives. No prior theological knowledge or qualifications are needed. It will be particularly useful for Sunday School teachers, youth group leaders, small group leaders, evangelists, church planters or lay readers. This course will lay a foundation for further theological training.

Q Who will be teaching the course?

The course will be taught by three experienced and enthusiastic tutors: Bishop Harold Miller (formerly Bishop of Down and Dromore), Revd Stuart Armstrong (St Saviour's Craigavon) and Dr Keith Gardiner (Diocesan Lay Reader and former university lecturer).

What do we expect from you?

- There are no exams or assignments.
- Those who attend are encouraged to read further, but the most important thing
 is to come regularly with a Bible and a desire to learn more about God's Word.
- Certificates will be awarded to participants who attend all three modules for at least 70% of the course.
- Ideally, participants should attend all the modules, but it is possible to sign up for just one or two.
- Each module costs £30 (payable at the beginning of each module).
