Dear Friends.

As a medical professional by background, temperature, heart rate, blood pressure and rate of breathing are the universally recognised vital signs of a person's health which measure the body's most basic functions.

When it comes to a church, Acts 2 verses 42–47, reveal the vital signs of a church's health to be Biblical teaching, prayer, worship, breaking of bread, community and generosity:

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to breaking of bread and to prayer.

Acts 2:42

This edition of Church Planting News is focused on one of these vital signs - the prayer life of our church plants. Please read on to find out how our churches are promoting a culture of prayer in Christian homes and kids' clubs, during services and for the wider community. Oswald Chambers in My Utmost for His Highest wrote: "We tend to use prayer as a last resort, but God wants it to be our first line of defense." Understanding that the success of our church plants and new missional initiatives are completely dependent on God drives us to pray and to ask you to join us in praying for these outreaches and their leaders.

We also have updates on the two newest outreaches – Ards Connect, led by Raymond McClure and The Suitcase Project, led by Tim Burns. Raymond and Tim include specific ways that you can pray for the work among young people on the Ards Peninsula and the Suitcase Project as it seeks to serve and welcome asylum seekers and refugees in East Belfast.



We are very thankful for the churches, Christian Trusts, business friends and individuals who faithfully support these new missional initiatives in Down and Dromore. In the first 4 months of 2024, we have received donations of £7,178 from diocesan churches £11,500 from Church of Ireland bodies, £86,000 from charitable trusts and grant giving bodies and £18,586 from business friends, individuals and mission agencies.

News from our newest projects



The Suitcase Project is underway in Emmanuel Hall on Roslyn Street. We have created a Conversational English Café which sees local volunteers sitting with newcomer individuals and families, talking with them, and helping them build their English language usage. We have had 14 countries represented. This has been a great stepping off point for the project.

I have just completed a Teaching English as a Foreign Language course and training on navigating Universal Credit. These areas will be important as the project moves forward and we look to support asylum seekers and refugees in various areas of life.

Throughout the diocese there are newcomers being moved into most of the areas that we have churches. I would love to visit you and share how we might connect to best support these newcomers.

PRAY That we would continue to build connections so that we can best serve newcomers and that God would mobilise volunteers across the diocese; for opportunities to meet with newcomers and the heart to listen and serve them; for those we have already met, that we would be able support and care for them at their point of need; for those who live in a new fear created by the Rwanda Bill; pray that God would guide my steps as we develop the work of the Suitcase Project.



At Ards Connect we've been busy engaging with Youth Groups throughout the Ards Peninsula, running engagement events, and talking about our work in schools.

Our last event was a Technology Information Night with 10 young people attending. We wanted to show them how their passion for all things creative could benefit their church and how we could help them to serve. We will be working out individual plans for each young person to learn some exciting new skills – live sound, podcast production, photography and video, and social media management.

In April, we ran a Student Night of Prayer and Praise. At this time of exams and deadlines, we wanted to encourage them and show them that God cares about their education. We gave students an opportunity to receive prayer if they were stressed or worried and we preached the gospel into those situations, praying that the Holy Spirit would bring peace and comfort.

We also teamed up with a local youth group to run a stress management workshop with a Christian counsellor. This was a perfect balance of prayer and practical help for those sitting exams and managing deadlines.

At Killough Youth & Children's
Outreach, prayer is always central to
every session that we deliver. Romans
12:12 says, "Rejoice in hope, be patient
in tribulation, be constant in prayer,"
and this verse has become foundational
for us as a team.

Our Kids Club nights look different each week but at the beginning and end our team prays together. We ask God to move in the lives of the children and young people attending, blessing them and their families in the love and hope that the Gospel brings. We pray that the Bible

stories they hear will be brought to their families and that the Gospel message of love and hope will spread to their home, friendships and relatives.

The children and young people are engaging with prayer more and more. We offer a space at the end of every night for prayer requests and use creative ways to pray for whatever is on their minds. It is so encouraging to see how they are open to share and pray for each other.

We are encouraged by our culture of prayer and it's one that we look to build on as the outreach develops and grows. Please continue to pray for us as we seek to develop and define what the outreach will look like from September 2024 as we will have opportunities to expand our reach in the Lecale area.

For a long time, we have really wanted to develop intercessory prayer at Tullycarnet Church. We recently appointed a coordinator for this and now host monthly prayer gatherings where we intercede for our Church, the local community, the nation, and the nations. Prayer at these gatherings is often creative and like a 24-7 Prayer Room.

Prayer ministry is valued highly in our Church Plant and is offered at the end of every service. It has been hugely encouraging to see prayer answered in the lives of our members through this ministry. At the moment, we are also expanding our small group discipleship environments. We have developed two "Growth Groups". One group is focusing on the spiritual disciplines whilst another is preparing for a crosscultural mission trip to Romania this summer.

The training involves 6 residential weekends per year. The autumn term includes induction to the programme and weekends on *The Wealth of the Cross, Mission and Evangelism, and Church History.*
